Our Impact

Since our IT centres opened...

- **122** students between the ages of 5 and 12 attended our 3 IT Community Centres in their first year (2019/20).
- **90%** of our IT students achieved the desired level of understanding and handling of IT software.
- **All** our IT students showed a higher level of understanding and handling of IT software than those not attending the centres.





Our Goals

- 1) Open our IT centres to the entire community.
- 2) Improve our centres, with better facilities and more specialised IT teachers' training.

What we need

In order to achieve our goals, in the school year 2021/22 we need a total of £14,030.

This covers the costs of IT furniture, laptops, teachers and the project coordinator's salaries and teachers' training for one year.

We also need advice on IT educational programme, software and teachers' training.
